UNIFORM WEAR

Cadets will be issued the official Air Force uniform and are required to wear it one day each week for the entire school day. An exception to this requirements is changing into gym clothes for physical education classes. However, cadets must change back into their uniform after physical education class is over. Uniform day for the 2019/2020 school year is every Wednesday, unless told otherwise by an ASI. Once issued, cadets are responsible for the maintenance and cleanliness of the uniform. Cadets will be inspected and graded on proper wear of the uniform in accordance with Air Force Standards of Dress and Personal Appearance AFI 36-2903 and the Cadet Handbook. Failure to wear the uniform and/or comply with all dress and appearance standards (to include grooming, hair, wear of jewelry, etc.) will result in immediate disenrollment from the program. Be sure to review the above mentioned references for further details on requirements. Cadets must turn in a professionally dry cleaned uniform at the end of the school year or when requested by an instructor.

Wearing the uniform, on the designated uniform day, to school one day each week is a course requirement.

Grades will be based on the following criteria:

A. Uniform – 40% B. Test – 30%

C. Quiz – 20 %

D. Assignments – 10%

PROMOTIONS

Superior performance may lead to advancement in rank and future selection to positions of increased responsibility. In order to get promoted, cadets must have a positive attitude towards JROTC and cooperate with other cadets in positions of authority. A cadet must contribute to cadet corps projects and activities, maintain acceptable bearing and behavior in all classes, maintain a "C" or higher average in JROTC, participate in community service events, and pass al other classes. The instructors must look at each cadet's report card every marking period to verify promotion eligibility.
